Aurora & the REACH Directive

The REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals) regulations were introduced by the EU and came into force across European Union Member States on 1 June 2007. It's purpose is to protect human health and the environment from the effects of dangerous chemicals. The regulations affect all businesses in the EU that manufacture, import and distribute chemicals in quantities greater than one tonne per annum.

Each manufacturer, importer and distributor is expected to register and provide data on the chemical substances with which they are involved. The substances will be evaluated by the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) for their risk and hazardous content. Certain chemicals have been classified as "Substances of Very High Concern" (SVHC's). Actions will then be recommended to those businesses affected by the regulations.

At this time, Aurora Ltd. does not supply any products to our customers that require registration with REACH.

We have reviewed all our products and do not have any that we supply with a chemical content that requires registration with this directive.

As Aurora falls under the category of a distributor of chemicals in quantities of less than one tonne per annum, Aurora is exempt from the REACH regulations at the current time. However, Aurora will consistently monitor its' position and obligations to these regulations as we are committed to making our customers & suppliers aware of the impact of these regulations.
